Reflection

It's really him! The weeks after Easter are the time for the Church to recount the stories shared by the first disciples of Jesus that say so much about the transforming nature of God's resurrection power.

They capture in different ways something of the mixture of wonder, fear, awe and doubt that colour the disciple's world at that moment. In the reading today we learn of the fear of the disciples who need to have the offer to touch and reach out to the Risen Jesus.

Still not convinced, Jesus takes and eats a piece of fish. It all goes to show the disciples that it's really him, it really is Jesus returned from death.



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It's only then, as the realisation begins to dawn upon them that Jesus is with them, that he begins to teach. Jesus explains how all that has happened – all of the suffering, grieving, and surprise and wonder of the last few days – has been part of the broader story of God's ongoing purpose. The Law and Prophets stand in in Luke's story as shorthand for the whole of salvation history, pointing to this moment. Easter will shape their lives and the life of the world, bringing new purpose and hope.

Jesus greets them in peace, a sure sign of God's presence. And as the disciples recognise the master

in their midst, he brings about a growing awareness of where God has always been active. As a result there's a new message to share, which is as old as God's love and grace. There's a new purpose to live for. Life takes on a new dimension.

Easter continues to offer that for us too. That focus of looking at our lives and the world around us and seeing that "it's really him!" alive and at work. Where we sense God's leading and prompting to inspire and guide, we are experiencing the reality of Easter. May that knowledge and joy lead us too to share what we have found in our Risen Lord.
