REFLECTION

"There shall be one flock and one Shepherd "

A flock of sheep owned and controlled by one shepherd or farmer, are very alike and are content to be together. Often bred in the same environment and with the same blood line. They have established natural leaders. Often staying on the same farm most of their life. Put a stranger among them and it does not look the same. Someone said "all sheep look alike "They certainly do not. A flock on the whole is usually quite content with their shepherd. They know His/ her voice. Of course there are always those who are stubborn, disobedient, the run aways, the strays, those who will find a hole in which to escape. The shepherd knows them all. The true Shepherd loves them all and makes allowances for them.

A deep Spiritual truth here, spelt out for each one of us. Jesus said "My sheep hear my voice, a stranger they will not follow." I have quite a few books on sheep and shepherds. One by a New Zealand person by the name of Godfrey Bowen A committed Christian, who has traveled worldwide. Won Sheep shearing records and in his book published 1988 has this very poignant poem.

Twas a sheep, not a lamb that went astray in the parable that Jesus told.

Twas a sheep that wandered away from the ninety and nine in the fold.

And out on the hilltops and out in the cold

Twas a sheep that the Good Shepherd brought back to the fold,

Now why should the sheep be so carefully fed and cared for today?

Because there is a danger if they go wrong, they will lead the lambs astray.

For the lambs will follow the sheep you know.

Where ever they wander, where ever they go. If the sheep go wrong, it will not be long,

Till the lambs are as wrong as they.

So still with the sheep we must earnestly plead, for the sake of the lambs today.

If the lambs are lost what terrible cost, some sheep will have to pay,

What a stark truth there is in that poem.

By our example, by our love, by our care by our witness, what do the lambs of today see? A world that seems to have lost its way. Where human dignity and respect is sadly lacking so often. What are the sheep doing.

All can hear the Shepherds voice in Worship. THIS DO IN REMEMBRANCE OF ME, and His voice of commission, Love one another as I have loved you.

What a flock. Each Sunday or Sabbath all around the world One flock, coming together to Worship the One Good Shepherd. To be nourished, to be fed.to drink of the water of life. What a joy to be part of that flock. Yes there is still illness there are still problems, There are disappointments But we have the good Shepherd to guide us. To hear our prayers. We often have to walk in the valley. He has been there before us. Call to Him, He is near.

As Christians we need the fellowship of those who follow the same path. Let our love and compassion be a witness to the care and forgiveness of our Saviour and Redeemer.

In St John Ch. 3 v. 16 God so loved the world that He gave His one and only Son that whoever believes on Him shall not perish but have eternal life. AMEN
